1. Purpose

Bullying is defined as unwanted, aggressive behaviour among school-aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. Because the behaviour is repetitive—or has the potential to be repeated—it can cause serious, long-lasting harm to victims, bullies and by-standers alike. The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) classifies bullying as a "critical" issue on school campuses.

St. Anselm's Senior Secondary School is committed to providing a safe, inclusive environment for every student. We therefore adopt a zero-tolerance policy toward any form of harassment or intimidation.

2. Objectives

- **1. Raise Awareness –** Educate students, staff and parents about the definition, signs and consequences of bullying.
- **2. Prevent Incidents –** Implement proactive measures that reduce the occurrence of bullying behaviour.
- **3. Intervene Promptly –** Ensure swift, fair and transparent response to every reported case.
- **4. Support All Parties –** Provide counselling and guidance to victims, bullies and witnesses to mitigate short- and long-term effects.
- 5. Monitor & Review Track incidents, analyse trends and refine policies annually.

3. Key Activities

- Orientation Sessions Conduct introductory workshops for all classes (VI-XII) at the start of the academic year.
- Curriculum Integration Incorporate anti-bullying themes into the Moral Science/Value Education syllabus.
- Peer-Mentor Programme Train senior students as "Buddy Mentors" who can intervene early and guide younger peers.
- Anonymous Reporting Maintain a secure online portal and a suggestion box for confidential complaints.
- Parent-Teacher Collaboration Hold quarterly meetings to discuss progress and share best practices.
- Regular Surveys Administer term-wise questionnaires to gauge the school climate and identify hidden issues.

4. Response Protocol

- **1. Report Any stude**nt, staff member or parent may report an incident via the portal, box or directly to a committee member.
- **2. Acknowledgement –** The complaint is logged and the complainant receives an acknowledgement within 24 hours.
- **3. Investigation A designated team conducts a fair, impartial inquiry, interviewing all relevant parties.**
- **4. Action –** Based on findings, appropriate measures are taken, which may include counselling, parental involvement, detention or, in severe cases, suspension.
- **5. Follow-up The** committee monitors the student's wellbeing for a minimum of six weeks and adjusts interventions as needed.5. Expected Outcomes
- A measurable reduction in reported bullying incidents by the end of the academic year.
- Increased confidence among students to report concerns without fear of retaliation.
- Enhanced empathy and social-emotional skills across the school community.
